# JOBS AXED IN POLICE CUTS

**POLICE** chiefs have agreed a budget of nearly £200 million for the Surrey force but say it must still make "significant cuts" including shedding more than 140 officers and staff.

Members of Surrey Police Authority (SPA) agreed a £198.8 million budget for 2009 to 2010.

This represents a 3.8% increase on the county force's budget and a 4.8% increase in its share of county funds. But the SPA said that despite the "substantial gap" in its budget after years of underfunding from the Government.

The SPA said this had left Surrey taxpayers footing about half of their police's budget, compared with a national average of less than 25%.

The new SPA members heard Surrey Police would continue to undergo cuts to close its budget gap.

Over the next year, the force will make savings of £3.8 million through measures including reorganising departments and cutting the four policing divisions to three.

But the authority said its scope for making further savings had narrowed and it had become increasingly difficult to protect front-line services.

The reduction of about 144 officers and staff will be made through reduced bureaucracy and streamlined support services, so as not to damage the quality of policing seen by the public.

Auditor chairman Peter Williams said: "Ultimately, the choice we faced was whether or not to make cuts to important and effective front-line policing services, or to increase the county's tax share to protect them in the long term, and we will continue to do all that."

Acting Chief Constable Mark Rowley said: "We have had to take painful decisions this year to try to protect front-line services at a time where the money to pay for them has been exceptionally tight."

"We are committed to providing value for money for local people and this is best demonstrated by our intention to continue improving on the high quality of service provided that has resulted in over 90% of the public having confidence in the policing of their neighbourhood, while striking the force by 144 people."

"We are determined to do better with less by focusing on what local people want and not chasing a myriad of targets."

Surrey County Council has written to the Government demanding ministers stop "clobbering" local residents for cash and urging Local Government Minister John Hargreaves to set up an independent commission to decide how much Government funding councils get.
